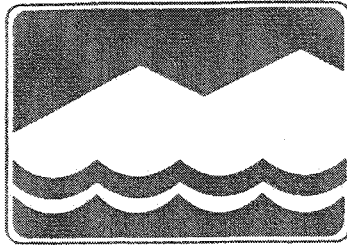

Overview: Lake Lillinonah Authority (LLA) was established by state statute to oversee environmental, safety and recreational needs of Lake Lillinonah. The Authority operates a lake patrol to assure safety of the public during boating activities and other recreational uses. The Authority treats the water to control algae and milfoil. The organization maintains a long-term water-testing program in collaboration with the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection. The towns of Bridgewater, Brookfield, New Milford, Newtown, Roxbury and Southbury fund the Authority.

Administrative: The Authority completed 12 monthly meetings that were attended by representatives from Bridgewater, Brookfield, New Milford, Newtown, Roxbury and Southbury. Quorums were met at all meetings. Meetings were held at 7:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month at Brookfield Town Hall.

Patrol activities: The Authority's most visible contribution to member towns is the Lake Lillinonah Patrol that enforces Connecticut's boating laws to assure that boating and water sports activities are conducted safely. In addition, the Patrol assists boaters with mechanical problems, responds to emergencies, provides watercraft for scientific projects (water monitoring and testing) and, in general, maintains "law and order" on the lake. In order to accomplish these tasks, the Patrol maintains three on-water vehicles.

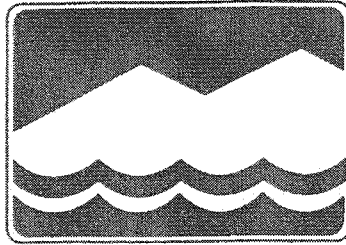
During the 2010 boating season, officer hours were:

- Patrol and Administration -584.75
- Court -10.00
- Equipment maintenance -69.50
- Assist other agencies - 36.00
- Training - 38.00
- Water testing - 26.75
- Emergency Call-Outs - 8.5

The following enforcement activities were accomplished:

- Infractions - 16
- Written warnings - 5
- Verbal warnings - 82
- Assists to boaters - 55
- Boat inspections - 39
- Trespassing - 8
- Contacts - 138

Water treatment: The annual water treatment activities to control algae and milfoil were completed. These activities require review the approval of the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection and are completed by an approved contractor. The authority completed four treatments for algae and one for milfoil, an invasive plant species that has become increasingly problematic. The Authority's goal is to conduct the least number of water treatments that are consistent with maintaining water quality. Additional avenues of water treatment are being explored. Connecticut DEP has announced that Zebra Mussels, a highly invasive species, have been discovered in Lake Lillinonah. The Authority is working with other organizations affected by this infestation to set up a monitoring program and explore methods of limiting the invasion.

Other Activities

Patrol Boat: The Authority has purchased a new Boston Whaler patrol boat which will begin service during the 2011 season. The vessel was purchased to replace the most aged vessel whose maintenance costs had become excessive. The purchase was completed with funds drawn from the Authority's capital reserve fund that had been built up over time to address this issue. A purchaser has been located for the old boat and ownership is being transferred. Also, an out-of-service engine has been sold.

Lake Alert: In response to requests from Lake users, the Authority funds and maintains a call alert system to notify interested parties about fluctuating water levels on the lake. These changing levels can be caused by weather, scheduled draw downs, or other reasons.

Website: The Lake Authority's website can be view at www.lakelillinonahauthority.org. The site is being continually enhanced and maintained, and serves as a central repository for lake information and meeting minutes.
